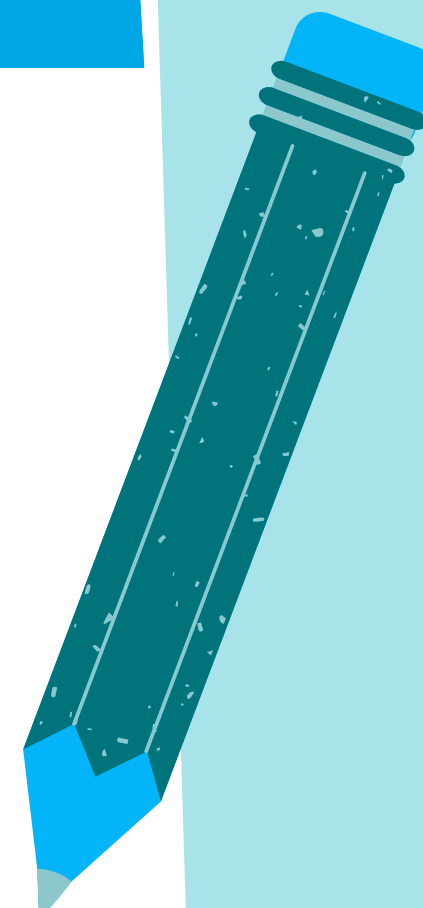

Reading in Year 5

AR is a computer program that helps teachers manage and monitor a child's independent reading practice. Children pick a book that falls within their Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD) level from the library. When they have finished reading, they take a short quiz on the computer – passing the quiz with at least 85% correct answers is an indication that the child has understood what has been read. Alongside this, we also encourage them to develop a love of reading by providing a wide variety of books in the classroom for them to explore and enjoy. Our aim is to help children become confident readers while fostering a lifelong passion for books.

Attendance

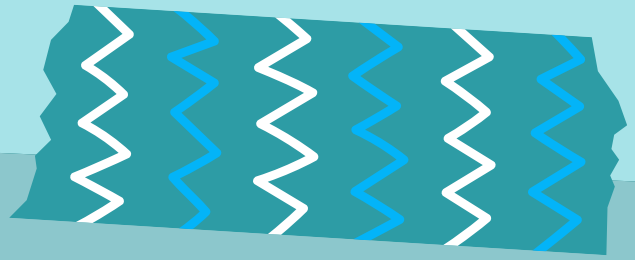
Regular attendance ensures that children can access the wide range of personal development opportunities and achieve the best possible outcomes. Key reasons why it is important to attend school:
