Reading in Year 1

In Year I, we follow the Read Write Inc. programme to help children learn to read through structured phonics lessons. Alongside this, we also encourage them to develop a love of reading by providing a wide variety of books in the classroom for them to explore and enjoy. Our aim is to help children become confident readers while fostering a lifelong passion for books.









oracy

Oracy is a key part of our school ethos, as we believe that every child's voice is important. We have a no opt—out culture, where all children are encouraged to share their ideas, opinions, and thoughts, fostering confidence in speaking. By valuing their contributions, we help them develop essential communication skills that will benefit them not just in the classroom, but throughout their lives.







Curriculum Enrichment

Our curriculum is enriched by a wide range of extracurricular clubs and numerous educational trips and visits, all fully funded by the school. We take pride in this unique offer, providing children with amazing additional opportunities beyond the classroom. We encourage children to try as many new activities as possible, with clubs updated every term to keep things fresh and exciting. These experiences are designed to inspire curiosity, build confidence, and broaden their horizons.









Phonics Screening Check

The Phonics Screening Check is a short and simple assessment that takes place in June to help us see how well your child is learning to read using phonics. It involves your child reading a list of real and made-up words to check their ability to sound out and blend words. Reading regularly at home, especially with their Read Write Inc. book, will make a big difference and give your child the best chance of doing well.

- Children are expected to read with an adult as much as they can and where possible 5 times a week.
- Children are expected to practise their spellings each week for a spelling test on Friday. Your child's score will be written in their Home Learning Books.

X No More Reading Diaries

We are no longer using traditional reading diaries from September. This change follows feedback from staff and families and research showing diaries have limited impact on reading outcomes. Many parents found them stressful or difficult to keep up with, and we want to keep reading positive and pressure-free.

A Fresh, Fun Approach!

Each term, children will receive an TBP Reading Challenge bookmark. These fun, themed challenges encourage children to read widely and enjoyably. Each challenge completed = a stamp on their bookmark and a raffle ticket for the termly book prize draw! This is about building a lifelong love of reading, not ticking boxes.

- · Read together regularly—even just 10 minutes a day.
- · Talk about books, ask questions, and celebrate their reading choices.




Attendance
